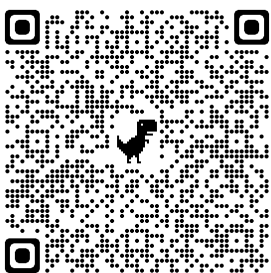




2023 John Gee Memorial Lecture

Before Algorithmic Armageddon: The Immediate Risks of AI in War



In this lecture, Professor Toni Erskine will argue that we are overlooking grave risks that accompany our increasing reliance on AI in war.

A neglected danger that AI-enabled weapons and decision-support systems pose is that they change how we (as citizens, soldiers, and states) deliberate, how we act, and how we view ourselves as responsible agents. This could have profound ethical, political, and even geo-political implications – well before AI evolves to a point where some fear that it could initiate algorithmic Armageddon.

Toni Erskine is Professor of International Politics in the Coral Bell School of Asia Pacific Affairs at ANU, Associate Fellow of the Leverhulme Centre for the Future of Intelligence at Cambridge University, and Chief Investigator of the Defence-funded ‘Anticipating the Future of War: AI, Automated Systems, and Resort-to-Force Decision Making’ Research Project.
