

Reverting to the Norm: Locating the Parliament in Indonesias Democratic Regression

How should we locate Indonesia's parliament in the apparent rollback of democracy in the country? This article argues that we need to contextualise the undermining of legislative power since the brief period of reformasi within the legacies of Indonesia's post-independence history of autocratic government. Inherited presidential practice, limited constitutional reform and the parliament's own internal procedures have contributed to a weakening of parliament.
