Existing literature portrays China's private capital flows and Chinese-origin transnational criminals (COTCs) in Southeast Asia and the Pacific as a shared pathology or beyond Beijing's control. This talk challenges that view, presenting evidence of a crime-state nexus. Through the cases of She Zhijiang and Wan Kuok-Koi, the speakers argue for periodic, mutually beneficial cooperation - not direct Beijing control - where criminal, business, and United Front-affiliated actors operate in an ambiguous shared milieu.

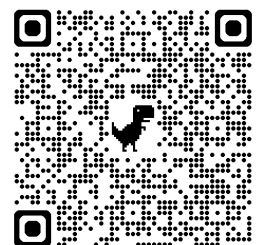
